Job Description

The Georgia Department of Community Health, [Division of Public Health](#) is seeking qualified candidates for our **ADAP Pharmacist for the Office of Pharmacy** in our Atlanta office.

Under general supervision of the Public Health State Office Pharmacy Director and the Public Health State Office Assistant Pharmacy Director, the ADAP Pharmacist provides the HIV Unit information and specialized pharmaceutical services related to the state of Georgia's AIDS Drug Assistance Program. The position will be located at the state office at 2 Peachtree Street in Atlanta, Georgia. The incumbent will work closely with the HIV Section including ADAP and the Ryan White Part B (Title II) Quality Management Program, the State Public Health Pharmacy Director, Assistant Pharmacy Director, Chief Nurse, as well as collaborate with national, state, and local health care providers and organizations in the areas of Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) treatment. Activities include strategic and operational planning for ADAP, implementation and evaluation of the ADAP Alternative Methods Demonstration Project, audits of contracted pharmacies, performance measurement for HIV treatment and adherence, and participation in the Quality Management Program.

Other activities include supervising operations of the management of 340B purchased pharmaceuticals in the areas of drug storage, handling, distribution and documentation as required by law; developing, coordinating, and participating in educational programs and ADAP education for pharmacy staff, nurses, and other disciplines; developing HIV-related policies, procedures, and protocols, monitoring drug utilization of ADAP, patient care and pharmacotherapy for HIV patients, and the results of public health initiatives directed at outcomes of therapy and ADAP.

Qualifications

The successful candidate must possess a Current Georgia license to practice Pharmacy (by the Georgia Board of Pharmacy Examiners) AND two years of professional pharmacy experience.

Preferred Qualifications

Preference will be given to applicants who in addition to meeting the entry qualifications possess the following:

Completion of a Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D) and one year of professional pharmacy experience.
