**Members Absent**

The Board of Community Health held its regularly scheduled meeting at the Department of Community Health (DCH), Fifth Floor Board Room, 2 Peachtree Street, N.W., Atlanta, Georgia. Commissioner Clyde L. Reese, III was also present. (An agenda and a List of Attendees are attached hereto and made official parts of these Minutes as Attachments #1 and #2). Chairman Norman Boyd presided and called the meeting to order at 10:31 a.m.

**Minutes**

The Minutes of the March 10, 2016 meeting were unanimously approved.

**Opening Comments**

Chairman Boyd informed the Board that due to Vice Chairman Clay Cox's resignation, the Board will nominate and vote on the vacant Vice Chairman's seat.

Chairman Boyd nominated Roger Folsom. There were no other nominations.

Chairman Boyd noted the following about Mr. Folsom:

- He is the president and owner of Med1st.
- He is a member of the Fairview Park Hospital Board of Trustees.
- He resides in Dublin, Ga.

Vote: The yeas were 8, nays 0, abstained 0, and the nomination of Roger Folsom as Vice Chairman was APPROVED.

## **Committee Reports**

None to report.

## **Commissioner's Report**

None to report due to the extensive agenda.

Lisa Marie Shekell, Director of Communications and Legislative Affairs, presented to the Board a high-level overview of the 2016 Legislative Session. The presentation highlighted legislation that passed and has a direct impact on the Department. It was explained that following the presentation, DCH leadership will conduct a programmatic review and create implementation plans as needed.

(A copy of the 2016 Legislative Update is attached hereto and made an official part of these minutes as Attachment #3).

Elizabeth Brady, Chief Financial Officer, presented to the Board provided an overview of the AFY 2016 and FY 2017 DCH budget as passed by the General Assembly (HB 750 and HB 751, respectively). The state funds overview was comprised of two sections: 1) benefit items for the Low-Income Medicaid (LIM), Aged, Blind and Disabled (ABD) Medicaid, PeachCare, and Indigent Care Trust Fund programs; and 2) operational items for the Administration, Health Care Access and Improvement, Healthcare Facility Regulation, and Boards of Dentistry and Pharmacy programs. The other funds overview for the State Health Benefit Plan (SHBP) program then followed.

Ms. Brady explained that the AFY 2016 budget included “have to” items such as projection updates, federal reporting requirements, and increases in Medicare Parts B and D costs. FY 2017 included items in addition to “have to” items – such as provider rate enhancements for multiple provider types and a merit-based pay adjustment for state employees. Ms. Brady also pointed out that the State realized savings through a more favorable federal match rate for Medicaid benefits, and the 100% federal matching rate for the PeachCare program. Another significant budgetary update for DCH is the transfer of administration of the Community Care Services Program (CCSP) waiver from the Department of Human Services to the DCH, effective July 1, 2016. Ms. Brady mentioned that the department also received \$3 Million in General Obligation bonds to support the design, development, and implementation of the Integrated Eligibility System (IES) – the Georgia Gateway.

Mr. Trail inquired if the State was continuing to receive 90/10 funding for the eligibility system. Ms. Brady confirmed that is the case. Chairman Boyd asked Ms. Brady what the next steps are in the budget process. Ms. Brady explained that the department will be receiving Annual Operating Budget (AOB) instructions from the Office of Planning

and Budget, and will set up the budget according to the parameters of the AOB instructions and HB 751. She also explained that the department is developing budget projections for AFY 2017 and FY 2018 and will be sharing those with the department's funding partners in order to begin discussions and planning for the next budget cycle.

(A copy of the AFY2016 and FY2017 Budget Overview is attached hereto and made an official part of these minutes as Attachment #4).

John Upchurch, Director of Reimbursement, briefed the Board on the request for initial adoption of the Medicaid Nursing Home Services Rate Increase Public Notice. The General Assembly appropriated \$35,104,070 total funds and \$11,300,000 in state funds for a 3% inflationary increase to 2012 cost reports for State Fiscal Year 2017. DCH proposes to implement this increase effective July 1, 2016 for those nursing homes currently paid based on their 2012 cost report. This change is subject to the Governor's approval of the State Fiscal Year 2017 budget and approval by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).

Written comments were accepted on or before April 26, 2016. Mr. Upchurch respectfully asked for the Board's favorable consideration of initial adoption.

Donna Thomas Moses MADE a MOTION to approve for Initial adoption Medicaid Nursing Home Services Rate Increase Public Notice. Roger Folsom SECONDED the MOTION. ON THE MOTION, the yeas were 8, nays 0, abstained 0, and the MOTION was APPROVED. (A copy of the Medicaid Nursing Home Services Rate Increase Public Notice is attached hereto and made an official part of these minutes as Attachment #5).

Mr. Upchurch next briefed the Board on the request for initial adoption of the Medicaid and PeachCare Physician Rate Increase for Primary Care Public Notice. For State Fiscal Year 2017, the General Assembly appropriated \$84,502,275 in total funds and \$26,503,397 in state funds to continue to move towards restoration of the rate increase to those physicians and physician extenders who qualified for and received the Primary Care rate increase under the Affordable Care Act in 2013 and 2014. The increase is funded for 32 service codes, at 100% of 2014 Medicare.

This change is to be effective July 1, 2016 and is subject to the Governor's approval of the State Fiscal Year 2017 budget and approval by CMS.

2016. Mr. Upchurch respectfully asked for the Board's favorable consideration of initial adoption.

Roger Folsom MADE a MOTION to approve for Initial adoption Medicaid and PeachCare Physician Rate Increase for Primary Care Public Notice. Mark Trail SECONDED the MOTION. ON THE MOTION, the yeas were 8, nays 0, abstained 0, and the MOTION was APPROVED. (A copy of the Medicaid Physician Rate Increase for Primary Care Public Notice is attached hereto and made an official part of these minutes as Attachment #6).

Mr. Upchurch next briefed the Board on the request for initial adoption of the Medicaid Physician Rate Increase for Obstetrical and Gynecological Care Public Notice. For FY 2017, the General Assembly appropriated \$10,757,532 in total funds and \$3,463,925 in state funds for an increase in the rates for antepartum care provided by OB/GYN physicians. The increase is funded for 24 service codes, at 100% of 2014 Medicare. .

This change is to be effective July 1, 2016 and is subject to the Governor's approval of the State Fiscal Year 2017 budget and approval by CMS.

An opportunity for public comment will be held on April 19, 2016 at 3:00 p.m. at the Department of Community Health (2 Peachtree Street, N.W., Atlanta, Georgia 30303) in the 5th Floor Board Room. Written comments were accepted on or before April 26, 2016. Mr. Upchurch respectfully asked for the Board's favorable consideration of initial adoption.

Allana Cummings MADE a MOTION to approve for Initial adoption Medicaid Physician Rate Increase for Obstetrics and Gynecology Public Notice. Michael Kleinpeter SECONDED the MOTION. ON THE MOTION, the yeas were 8, nays 0, abstained 0, and the MOTION was APPROVED. (A copy of the Physician Rate Increase for Obstetrics and Gynecology Public Notice is attached hereto and made an official part of these minutes as Attachment #7).

Mr. Upchurch then briefed the Board on the request for initial adoption of the establishment of a Medicaid Newborn Delivery Add-On for Rural Hospitals Public Notice. The General Assembly appropriated \$1,203,500 in total funds and \$387,407 in state funds to establish a \$250 add-on payment for each newborn delivery for hospitals in rural counties with a population of less than 35,000. This increase impacts 19 rural hospitals.

This change is to be effective July 1, 2016 and is subject to the Governor's approval of the State Fiscal Year 2017 budget and approval by CMS.

Board member Mark Trail commented that DCH should monitor this action to insure it does not create a disincentive for rural hospitals to transfer newborn cases to tertiary care facilities when appropriate.

Mark Trail MADE a MOTION to approve for Initial adoption Medicaid Newborn Delivery Fee Add-on Payment for Rural Hospitals Public Notice. Michael Kleinpeter SECONDED the MOTION. ON THE MOTION, the yeas were 8, nays 0, abstained 0, and the MOTION was APPROVED. (A copy of the Newborn Delivery Fee Add-on Payment for Rural Hospitals Public Notice is attached hereto and made an official part of these minutes as Attachment #8).

Marcey Alter, Assistant Chief of Medicaid for Policy and Provider Services, presented four Public Notices for Initial Adoption. All of which are for rate increases as a result of Legislative appropriations. All also require approval by CMS.

Ms. Alter presented the Specialized Nursing Home Ventilator Care Rate Increase Public Notice to the Board for initial adoption.

- A 3% increase is proposed in the rate of reimbursement for mechanical ventilation services.
- The last increase was made in October 2013.
- The annual fiscal impact is \$295,250 in total funds and \$95,041 in state funds.

ON THE MOTION, the yeas were 8, nays 0, abstained 0, and the MOTION was APPROVED. (A copy of the Specialized Nursing Home Ventilator Care Rate Increase Public Notice is attached hereto and made an official part of these minutes as Attachment #9).

Ms. Alter next presented the Independent Care Waiver Program (ICWP) Personal

Support Services Rate Increase Public Notice to the Board for initial adoption.

- An increase is proposed for all levels of personal support services that would achieve parity in the rates paid for similar services in the in the Community Care Services Program (CCSP) and Service Options Using Resources in a Community Environment (SOURCE) waiver programs.
- The annual fiscal impact is \$11,725,325 in total funds and \$399,670 in state funds.

ON THE MOTION, the yeas were 8, nays 0, abstained 0, and the MOTION was APPROVED. (A copy of the Independent Care Waiver Program (ICWP) Personal Support Services Rate Increase Public Notice is attached hereto and made an official part of these minutes as Attachment #10).

Ms. Alter next presented the Rate Increase for Adult Day Services provided through the Elderly and Disabled Waiver Public Notice to the Board for initial adoption.

- An increase of 5% for both full and partial day rates for adult day habilitation services is proposed. The annual fiscal impact is \$1,241,597 in total funds and \$399,670 in state funds.

ON THE MOTION, the yeas were 8, nays 0, abstained 0, and the MOTION was APPROVED. (A copy of the Rate Increase for Adult Day Services provided through the Elderly and Disabled Waiver Public Notice is attached hereto and made an official part of these minutes as Attachment #11).

Ms. Alter then presented the Children’s Intervention Services (CIS) Program, Occupational Therapy and Physical Therapy Rate Increase Public Notice to the Board for initial adoption.

- An increase to 80% of the 2014 Medicare rates for select occupational therapy and physical therapy services is proposed.
- The annual fiscal impact is \$8,544,406 in total funds and \$2,747,225 in state funds.

Mark Trail MADE a MOTION to approve for Initial adoption Children’s Intervention Services (CIS) Program, Occupational Therapy and Physical Therapy Rate Increase Public Notice. Donna Thomas Moses SECONDED the MOTION. ON THE MOTION, the yeas were 8, nays 0, abstained 0, and the MOTION was APPROVED. (A copy of the Children’s Intervention Services (CIS) Program, Occupational Therapy and Physical Therapy Rate Increase Public Notice is attached hereto and made an official part of these minutes as Attachment #12).

Heather Bond, Assistant Chief, Regulatory Services and Compliance, presented the Advanced Life Support Emergency Ambulance Transport Rate Increase Public Notice to the Board for initial adoption.

Pending CMS approval, and subject to payment at fee for service rates, the Department is proposing a seven percent rate increase for advanced life support emergency ambulance transport. The rate increase is effective for dates of service on or after July 1, 2016.

The transport service eligible for the payment increase is billed under the Healthcare Common Procedure Coding System (HCPCS) as A0427:

Ms. Bond next presented the Medicaid Rate Setting for Safe to Sleep Agreement with the Department of Public Health (DPH) Public Notice to the Board for initial adoption.

DPH and DCH, Medical Assistance Plans (Medicaid and PeachCare), propose a contractual partnership to provide Medicaid mothers with newborn infants with bassinets and gowns to reduce Sudden Unexpected Infant Deaths (SUIDS).

DPH and DCH request to partner to provide safe to sleep bassinets approved by DPH to increase the likelihood of a safe sleep environment, and safe sleep behaviors by Medicaid and PeachCare mothers, thus decreasing the likelihood of SUIDs.

Special Instruction is provided for infants and children up to 3 to assess and treat 5 developmental domains.

Originating site means the location of an eligible Medicaid beneficiary at the time the service being furnished via a telecommunications system occurs. The services are furnished to a beneficiary at an originating site, which is any Georgia Medicaid enrolled pharmacy with the technological capacity to provide HIPAA compliant telemedicine services. Originating sites are billed as HCPCs code Q3014.

DCH, Medical Assistance Plans (Medicaid and PeachCare) respectfully request consideration of allowing Pharmacists to administer vaccines at an administration fee of \$10 per injection administered. Vaccines will be reimbursed at Average Sales Price (ASP) plus 6% as defined by the quarterly CMS ASP file.


#### New Business/Closing Comments
