Core Values


- **Provide access to resources that offer support and empower Georgians and their families.**

 - Harmony Database implementation is complete. All TCs in the state using electronic database to store information.
 - Craig Nursing Home Closing: DCH & DAS working with Div. of Mental Health (DBHDD) to assist with transition of MFP-eligible individuals. DAS will fold transitions into the standard MFP process.
 - Continuing to work with DCA to build wait lists for the TBRA and 811 housing programs
